School Trustee I Marc Andres

- There has been great progress in the Programs of Choice review. On Tuesday there will be a review at Fraser River Middle School
- There have been over 900 responses through the survey
- We will be creating focus groups for the following: What is working well? What are the challenges? What are the opportunities for improvement?
- High School Security Cameras have been installed outside bathrooms, and vape detectors have been installed in all bathrooms
- New childcare protocol will be discussed at the June 2023 school board meeting to ensure there is enough childcare spaces in the city
- The decommissioning of the old high school is underway. This should be complete in the next 6 months or so
- Fraser River Elementary design concept and approval is expected by June
- The school board is in budget review currently
- Marc will be back to attend our PAC meeting in June
- A possibility of a backpack program or a breakfast club for subsidized students in the school was discussed.
- Will a daytime custodian be brought back into any of the schools? Marc will bring this up at the budget meeting. It was discussed that this is a large problem at Glenbrook

Principal's Report I Ms. Catherwood

- There has been great success in the Reading Link Challenge for the Grade 4 and 5's. 75 kids
 participated the most ever! We started with 15 teams and it is now down to two teams in our school
 who will compete with other New West schools. The winners will compete in the Lower Mainland
 finals.
- The Grade 2's will be off to the VSO this month. 11 staff members will attend. Everyone is excited this trip is back on.
- Lacrosse will be starting the week of April 17th in PE classes. Senior Salmonbelly players will be running the sessions
- The children will no longer be lining up in the mornings. They have been practicing at recess and lunch and are doing great. The grade 1's will continue to line up at the front door. The K's line up will also remain the same.
- 2023/2024 calendar dates will be released in the coming weeks.
